Be it enacted by the General Assembly of to pay sundry Maryland, That the Comptroller be and he is hereby requested and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer to pay to Nathan Masters, late collector for Prince George's county, for taxes overpaid as per certificate of the Comptroller, thirty dollars and sixty-five cents; to Henry Kyd Douglas, for per diem and mileage as a witness before the Court of Appeals, seventeen dollars and forty cents; to James Hopkins, for repairs to picture in Senate Chamber, ten dollars; to W. L. Pfieffer, for work done and materials furnished in refitting House of Delegates, as per order of the Chief Clerk, four hundred and twenty-three dollars; to John Murphy and Company, for sundries furnished the Chief Clerk of the House
