141. The inhabitants of the Town of Port Deposit, Incorporated in Cecil county, are a corporation by the name of President and Commissioners of Port Deposit, and by that name shall have perpetual succession, may sue and be sued, may purchase, hold and dispose of real, personal and mixed property, for the use and benefit of said town, and may have and use a common seal, which may be altered at pleasure.

142. All male inhabitants of said town, citizens of Legal voters. the United States, above twenty-one years of age, who shall have bona fide resided in said town for the space of six months, and twelve months in the State next preceding the election, shall, on the last Monday in February, in each year, at such house as shall be designated by the President and Commissioners, by a notice to be put up in at least five of the most public places in said town at least one week before the day of election, elect, by ballot, seven judicious and discreet persons, citizens of the United States, Elect Comwho shall have resided within the limits of said town missioners. for at least twelve months preceding the election, as commissioners of said town; the persons thus elected as commissioners shall, within one month after their election, qualify by taking the oath prescribed by the sixth section of the first article of the Constitution of Maryland, before a Justice of the Peace in and for Cecil county, and at their first meeting, which shall
