If the majority of the ballots cast at said election have written or printed upon them the words "For the new act of Incorporation," then this act shall go into full effect on the first day of June next; but if the majority of said ballots have written or printed on them the words "Against the new act of Incorporation," then this Act shall be utterly null and void.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall go into effect from the date of its passage, so far as it relates to the election provided for in the last preceding section, but no further.

CHAPTER 348.

AN ACT to repeal sections eighty-two, eighty-three, eighty-four, eighty-five and eighty-seven of article eleven, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Frederick county," sub-title "Frederick," and to enact the following sections and sub-sections in lieu of and as substitutes therefor:

Repealed. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That sections eighty-two, eighty-three, eighty-four, eighty-five and eighty-seven, of article eleven, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Frederick county, relating to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Common Council of Frederick, be and the same are hereby repealed, and the following sections and sub-sections be enacted in lieu of and as substituted therefor.
