Sub-Sec. 9. The judges of election, under the pro-Duty of visions of this law, shall receive the ballot of every judges of qualified voter presented to them, whose name and election. designation shall appear upon the list of registered voters, and who shall present his ballot to them during the hours appointed for holding any election, and refuse the ballots of every person whose name and designation shall not appear upon the list of said qualified voters of his ward; and any judge of election wilfully and corruptly violating any of the provisions of this section, shall be guilty of a misdevisions of this section, shall be guilty of a misue-meanor, and liable to presentment and indictment Penalty for violating. therefor in the Circuit Court of Frederick county, and on conviction thereof shall be punished by confinement in the Penitentiary [house] of the State of Maryland for a period not exceeding seven years.

SUB-SEC. 10. This Act shall not interfere with the Not to interterm of office of the present Mayor, Board of Alder-fere. man, or Board of Common Councilmen of Frederick city.

Sub-Sec. 11. Said judges of election shall have and Judges of exercise the powers and authority of Justices of the election to Peace in and about the polls in their respective exercise wards, during all elections held under this Act, for powers of the purpose of maintaing order and preserving peace. justice.

SUB-SEC. 12. The said judges of election shall, Make return. within two days after any election, make a correct return of the result thereof to the Register of Frederick city, who shall immediately thereafter publish the same.

Sub-Sec. 13. All laws or parts of laws inconsistent Repealed. with this Act, and not herein expressly repealed, are hereby expressly repealed so far as necessary to give full effect to this Act, and no further.
