CHAPTER 371.

AN ACT to repeal section twelve of article [of] twenty-eight of the Code of Public General Laws, title "County Commissioners," and re-enact the same with amendments.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section twelve of article twenty-eight of the Code of Public General Laws, title "County Commissioners," be and the same is hereby repealed, and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as

Re-enacted. follows:

Compensat'n of County Commissi'nrs

SEC. 12. The County Commissioners of the several counties shall each receive three dollars per day for each day they shall be engaged in the discharge of their duties, and mileage at the rate of ten cents for every mile over five miles from their places of residence, except the County Commissioners of Baltimore county, who shall have and receive a salary of one thousand dollars per year each, including mileage, payable monthly by the Treasurer of said county; and said County Commissioners of Baltimore * are hereby required and directed to meet at their office in the Court House in Townsontown two days in each [every] week, (Tuesdays and Wednesdays,) and to meet daily from the first Tuesday in
