

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the three County Commissioners, now in office in said county, shall serve out the full time for which they were elected, and receive such compensation as is now prescribed by law. Now in office to serve out term.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That it shall be the duty of the Board of County Commissioners, hereafter to be elected under the provisions of this Act, for Wicomico county, and of their successors, at the first regular meeting of the board after they shall have qualified, to proceed to designate by lot two members of the said board, who shall remain in office for four years from the date of their election. Duty of those hereafter elected.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 398.

AN ACT to release to Mrs. Eleanor Koller all the rights and interest of the State of Maryland in and to the personal estate of William Frederick Carey, of Baltimore city, deceased.

WHEREAS, William Frederick Carey, late of the City of Baltimore, died intestate, leaving no widow, issue nor relatives of next of kin whatsoever capable of taking personal property by succession under the laws of this State; and Preamble.

WHEREAS, it appears that the personal property whereof the said Carey died possessed in this State, was acquired by the assistance of Eleanor Koller, who also, on other grounds, had equitable claims upon him; therefore, Preamble.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the rights and interests of the State of Rights and interests waived.
