The following members were added to the Select Committee, on yesterday appointed, to whom was referred the petition of George Robinson, Clerk of the Superior Court, et cetera: Messrs. Butler, Clark, of Montgomery, Waller, and Colton, of Baltimore City.

JOINT RESOLUTION:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Senators and Representatives of this State, in the Congress of the United States, are hereby requested to use their best efforts to procure the repeal of chapter 173, of the Act of Congress of 1864, or so much thereof as imposes a federal revenue tax on all property, real and personal, inherited by will, or the intestate laws of any State; and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded by the proper officer, to each one of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
