

The bill, entitled an Act to authorize the Trustees of the Methodist Protestant Church in Salisbury to sell and convey certain property belonging to them.

Said bill being upon a third reading,

On motion of Mr. Colton, of Baltimore City,

The vote by which said bill was ordered to a third reading was reconsidered.

The bill then being upon a second reading,

Mr. Johnson submitted the following amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED :

SECTION 3. *And be it enacted*, That the Trustees aforesaid be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell the Methodist Protestant Parsonage property, situate in that part of Salisbury town known as Camden, and to give a good and sufficient title to the same in fee.

Which was adopted.

Mr. Johnson submitted the following amendment :

Make present section 3 to read, "Section 4."

Which was adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
