Leave was granted to the Committee on Claims to introduce a bill to pay Washington A. Page for articles furnished the State Tobacco Warehouse, No. 1, in 1869.

Leave was granted to the Dorchester delegation to introduce a bill to authorize the County Commissioners of Dorchester county to build a bridge over Fishing Creek, at a point known as Fishing Creek Ferry, in said county.

On motion of Mr. Bond,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries to report a bill, to amend section 33, of Article LXXI. of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Oysters," as amended and re-enacted by the Act of 1870, chapter 364, which provides for the appointment of the Commissioners of the State Police Force, so as to constitute the Governor, Comptroller and Treasurer of the State the Board of Police Commissioners.
