The Senate bill, entitled an Act to amend Article **XCVIII.**, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Wild Fowl," by adding an additional section thereto, allowing the shooting of water fowl from sink-boats within the limits of Dorchester county on certain days in each week.

Mr. Smith, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably,

The bill, entitled an Act to revise and re-enact and amend certain sections of the Act passed January Session, 1852, chapter 316, entitled an Act to authorize the appointment of a Commissioner to take testimony to provide for the recording of copies of wills and other papers, of which the originals were lost by the burning of the court house in Dorchester county, and to remedy, as far as practicable, the evils likely to ensue from the destruction of the records of said county.

The Senate bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 193, of Article III., Public Local Laws, title "Baltimore County," sub-title "Sheriffs," reported the same without amendment.
