Leave was granted the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to repeal section 2, of Article XXX., of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Defaulters," approved April 4th, 1870, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

On motion of Mr. L. A. J. Lamotte,

Leave was granted the Carroll delegation to introduce a bill, to repeal the Act of 1868, chapter 112, entitled an Act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Westminster to the Baltimore and Liberty roads.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

Leave was granted to the Baltimore County delegation to introduce a bill repealing the Charter of Hall's Turnpike Road Company.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following bills, Severally endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays:"

The bill, entitled an Act to repeal section 65, Article XIX. of the Code of Public General Laws, of Somerset county, relating to the number of Justices of the Peace and Constables for said county, and to re-enact the same with amendments,
