Sec. 2, line 3, insert after the word "oath" the words "or affirmation."

Sec. 3, line 3, strike out "twenty" and insert "five."

Sec. 3, add at end of section the following words, "together with the fine and cost, as prescribed in the first section of the Act, and in default of payment of the said fine and impounding fee, the said swine may be sold to satisfy the same."

Sec. 4, line 2, add after the word "applied" the following, "one-half to the informer, and the balance."
