On motion of Mr. Miller (the rules being snspended,)

The House proceeded to the consideration of the Senate bill, entitled an Act to make valid certain bequests in the last will and testament of Mary C. Reynolds, late of Frederick county, deceased,

Said bill being upon a third reading,

On motion of Mr. Miller,

The further consideration thereof was postponed, and,

The bill recommitted to the Frederick county delegation.

The Secretary of the Senate returned the following bills, severally endorsed: "Passed by yeas and nays,"

The bill, entitled an Act amendatory of an Act passed at December Session, 1849, chapter 358, entitled an Act incorporating the Union Plank or Turnpike Road Company in Montgomery county.

The bill, entitled an Act to repeal, amend and re-enact chapter 361, passed at January Session, 1870, entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Harford county to sell a part of the Poor House Farm, and to erect suitable buildings for the use of the paupers of said county, and to levy a sum of money for that purpose.
