Mr. Staylor submitted the following order:

Ordered. That it be entered on the Journal, that if Mr. Staylor had been present when the bill to pay sick policemen passed, he would have voted for it.

Leave was granted to the Frederick delegation to introduce a bill, for the protection of fish in the waters of the Monacacy and its tributaries.

On motion of Mr. Groome,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Incorporations to introduce a bill, to allow the Elkton and Elk Valley Railroad, incorporated under the Acts of 1870, chapter 476, to charge a large sum for transportation and tolls, of persons and freight, than is authorized by the general incorporation Acts.

On motion of Mr. Smith,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill, to repeal section 3, of Article XCV., of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Usury," and to reenact the same with amendments.

On motion of Mr. Young, of Washington,

Leave was granted to the Washington delegation to introduce a bill, to authorize the Commissioners of Washington county to purchase property and move the Almshouse.

Mr. Groome presented certain resolutions adopted by a meeting of German citizens, held at the Maryland Institute March 6, 1872, against the repeal of the Sunday Law.
