A bill, entitled an Act to equalize the salary of the Judges of the Court of Appeals, with the salary of the Judges of the several Courts of Baltimore City.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Feig, from the Select Committee on that subject, to whom was re-committed

The bill, entitled an Act to repeal sections 179 and 180, of Article XXX., of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to "Sabbath Breaking," and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Reported back the same favorably.

The bill was then read a second time.

The bill, entitled an Act to appoint a Commissioner of Immigration to protect the interests of labor and agriculture in the State of Maryland; also revise and provide for all immigrants arriving at the port of Baltimore, in the State of Maryland.
