It was rejected.

The amendment submitted by Mr. Cooper was then adopted.

And, the bill, as amended, read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Miller submitted the following amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Section 1, strike out all after the word "Maryland" to the word "office," inclusive, and insert: "That the authorities of the City of Baltimore pay."

Which was rejected.

The bill, as amended, was then read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
