ten hours in each day, in any cotton or woolen factory in this State, under their, his, or her control or management, shall forfeit and pay a fine of fifty dollars for every such offence; said fine to be recoverable by indictment in any Court, or before any Justice of the Peace, having jurisdiction in the City or County, where the offence is committed.

Make section 2 read section 3.

Which were severally read and adopted.

Mr. Banks submitted the following amendment:

Section 1, line 3, strike out the words "cotton or woollen."
