Ordered, That the members of the House Select Committee be instructed to introduce a bill to authorize the Attorney General to institute proceedings by *sci. fa.* to forfeit the charter of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road, for stubbornly resisting the authorities of the State, and for gross violence of its privileges.
