The said Jury being returned, brought into Court the following verdict  
 read in the account of the sd Lambert (b<sup>ty</sup>) & the Jurors de fine Reg:  
 Lambert guilty of drunkenness, breach of the Peace, by fighting, cursing and abusing  
 some of their Ma<sup>ties</sup> Justices for this County, especially C<sup>t</sup>. Brown at the house  
 of Andrew Whittington Gunholder the 13<sup>th</sup> day of the said Gustav November.

Whereupon the Court O<sup>rd</sup> that the sd Lambert give security for his  
 good behaviour, O<sup>rd</sup>er. likewise to be fined for being drunk, breach of the Peace  
 fighting & cursing according to law. and also for his abuse to the Justices as it is  
 returne corporall punishment viz ten lashes upon his bare back well laid on; whiche  
 punishment by his submission was remitted.

And the fore same the sd Reg: Lambert and in open Court did by recognizance & oaths  
 him selfe to be ind: bound unto their Ma<sup>ties</sup> King William: and Queen Mary. in the  
 sum of one pound sterling money of England, due to be saved on his goods & chattels  
 and tenents for their Ma<sup>ties</sup> use. Likewise same the sd Lambert promised viz King  
 Chamber, John: Webb and Peter Whaples and did at due witness them selves in like  
 manner to be ind: bound in the sum of fifty pound sterling apiece to be saved as above  
 for their Ma<sup>ties</sup> use

The condition of whiche Recognizance is such that if the above bound Richard  
 Lambert be of the good behaviour and abstinence to all their Ma<sup>ties</sup> Kings people of  
 this province but more especially to their Ma<sup>ties</sup> Justices of the Peace for this  
 County, and also pay all fines and fees, that shall the Recognizance to be void, and  
 otherwise to be and remain in full force and vertue

O<sup>rd</sup>er. The aforesaid Jury in folio 10) to attend at Newmarket the next Court viz  
 the second Tuesday in December ann: 1690 being a Court of adjournment

O<sup>rd</sup>er. Likewise Andrew Whittington pay sd Jury upon Reg: Lambert's tryall 120  
 pounds of lawfull money due to sd Jury

William: Morris, as in folio 4: being committed into the Sheriff's custody. Cometh into Court  
 and by Recognizance, doth confess him selfe to be ind: bound to their Ma<sup>ties</sup> in 40<sup>th</sup> sterling money  
 to be saved on his good Chattels lands and tenements for their Ma<sup>ties</sup> use & likewise same  
 his promised Reg: Chamber, and Peter Whaples and p<sup>r</sup>. R<sup>oy</sup>. of 20. a piece, did in  
 like manner confess them selves as above, to the use as above pr:

The condition of whiche Recognizance is such that if the above bound W<sup>m</sup>: Morris be  
 of the good behaviour and abstinence to all their Ma<sup>ties</sup> Kings people of this Province, but  
 more especially to their Ma<sup>ties</sup> Justices of this County and also shall pay Court fees to  
 the n<sup>xt</sup> the Recognizance void, otherwise to be and remain in full force and vertue.
