
Maryland vs. Somerſet County

This Bill Cominge vs William: Gentleman of the County of Somerſet and Planter of Maryland Plaintiff and my Lord Exeter, doth firmly to pay unto C. William: Colborne of the same place and Procuror above named Gent. his heire, Executatores, Administratores or Assignes the just sum or quantity of four hundred and lame pounds weighte of good sound merchantable Barre of tobacco in Cash le rounde the same to be paid at or upon the tenth day of October next ensuing the date hereof at or withins my hand and Seal. Siquid sealed and delivered in the sight of us
