In Somerset County sh. William Browne of that County M<sup>or</sup> was attached to answer unto Thomas Roberts of the same County Plaintiff in an action upon the Cash.

And whereupon the pl<sup>t</sup> by James Sanger his attorney Com<sup>o</sup>rs says that in the month of August last past the d<sup>ft</sup> Browne indebted unto the pl<sup>t</sup> one good sufficient Cow and her calf, which sd Cow and calf was due to the pl<sup>t</sup> from John Barber and the sd Barber not having w<sup>o</sup>rite to pay the pl<sup>t</sup> did dispose of one servant woman to the d<sup>ft</sup> in order to satisfy y<sup>e</sup> pl<sup>t</sup> of one young mare one Cow and her calf and seven hundred pounds of tobacco, which sd particular the d<sup>ft</sup> did fail to pay and promise to pay, and in pursuance of the same the d<sup>ft</sup> hath delivered the mare to the pl<sup>t</sup> but demyst to give the pl<sup>t</sup> security for the Cow and calf which is but common right suite y<sup>e</sup> pl<sup>t</sup> was of the benefit last year and not due any other to satisfy or give security for the true payment & therefore bringe this Suite etc.

M. George Barber. Day unto M. Wm. Anderson or his Order. Sixteen hundred and eighty pounds of tobacco and Cash bringe the Gallants of your Bill due to us long since, fails not or else — part further trouble, for upon the payment of the money James ready to give you good security for Confirmation of your debt, which is all from y<sup>e</sup> friend of us Wm. Browne.

2900 the Gallants of this whole Bill is 2900.

Witness of Wm. Browne full satisfaction of all accounts from the beginning of the world to this day being seven hundred & fifty pounds of tobacco and Cash, and one Cow and a calf being for the use of one John Barber being in full of all accounts due from me William Browne, as witness my hand by me the 12. day of July 1690.
