

The Exposition of John. Carr. aged thirty five year or more. This Exponant saith that the last
 Autumn or fall of the last, there happening some Controversie betwixen Thomas Oxford & Stephen
 Bage about misfeignage of Swines belonging to the said Oxford. In the Exponant & the sd Oxford
 had leave granted by the sd Bage to view the said Bage's fence, the which we did do, and we
 found it sundry places defective and very insufficient, by disturbing wide holes therein in
 divers places of the sd fence, where swines might without difficulty pass and repass through holes
 in the said fence our fields as to the Exponant's understanding at least 18. Yards wide, and we
 the said witness, did take notice that there was no Corn at all in the said Bage's Corn field
 nor start any stalks of Corn, where it was said great damage was done, to the sd Oxford's Swine
 by Bage's people, and this Exponant further saith, that the sd Bage did acknowledge y^e hunting or
 souling of one hogg that morning, before viewing of the sd fence, and the sd Oxford desiring a
 reason of the said Bage, why he would the sd hogg, the Bage answered because you asked me three
 shillings a bushel for Corn. This the Exponant saith and further saith yet, to the truth whereof
 he hath sworn to with his hand.
