

With fore se Grand Jury being legally summoned and duly sworn upon the holy Evangelists with like wife
 having heard the forese Indictment the examination of the se Juritz, as also the Oathes of John Kemp and
 Edward Gold. who were legally summoned and sworn for their Malice agt the se Juritz. returned their Verdict
 and sent out ~~and~~ And this day viz the 1. day of 8 Oct 1591. The se Jury being returned in
 Court being called over by their Names, all being unanimously agreed do make return as follows viz

That of the Grand Jury find Ignorant upon the within Indictment given in by a forsworn
 Richard Chamberlaine

Ordered by this Court that Judith Dowd give good security for her good behaviour & appearance
 at our next County Court to be holden the 2. Tuesday in November next 1591. to answer to their Malice
 upon and Robert Dowd husband to the se Juritz and did by recognizance confess himself to be indebted to
 their Malice & M^{rs} Mary King & Susan of England for the sum of 60^l. Sterling money of England, due to
 Isabell on her goods and Chancellors Lands and Commoents for their Malice used &c.

The Return of Judice Recognizance is such that if Judith the wife of Robert Dowd be of
 the good behaviour and appearance to all their Malice Lige People of this County during this Courts
 pleasure as also make her personall appearance at our next County Court to answer to such matters & things as shall
 be then & there objected agt her that then she doth so Recognizance to be void and of none effect otherwise to be
 remain in full power force and virtue.

Ordered likewise that Robert Dowd give good security for his behaviour & appearance next Court
 to answer to their Malice as abovesd of his wife. Crer. nile Sheriff Custody till done

Whereupon came the se Robert Dowd with his two sureties viz John Rithms and Edward Gold. and
 said Robert in Open Court did confess himself to be justly indebted to their Malice in the sum of thirty
 pounds Sterling money of England, and the se Rithms and Gold did likewise confess themselves indebted to
 their Malice in the sum of thirty pounds a piece, all due to Isabell on her goods & Chancellors Lands & Commoents
 for their Malice used &c.

The Return of the abovesaid Recognizance is such that if the said Robert Dowd be of the good
 behaviour and appearance to all their Malice Lige people of this County during this Courts pleasure, as also shall
 make his personall appearance at our next County Court to be holden the second Tuesday in November then to answer
 to all such matters and things as shall be then & there objected agt him on behalf of their Malice, that then this Recognizance
 to be void & of none effect otherwise to be remain in full force & virtue.

Ordered likewise that John Kemp give security for his appearance next Court to answer to their Malice &c.
 Order likewise Sheriff keep the se Kemp in Custody till security given.
 Whereupon came the se Kemp & his two sureties viz Thomas Sturte & Wm. Henderson & the se Kemp did confess
 himself to be indebted to their Malice in the sum of 20^l. Sterling money of England, and the se Sturte and
 Henderson did likewise and newbesse themselves to be indebted to their Malice the sum of ten pounds like money to
 be labored on their goods & Chancellors Lands & Commoents for their Malice used &c.
