AT THE GRAND JURY MARCH THE 10th 1690

The subscriber being Complainant and proffited by Walter Taylor as being guilty of an
aggravated that in his act so Walter's perfidious and willfull malice of cutting of Cypress
timber into numerous small pieces more than into eight pieces each, then in putting of the
timber fraudulently with only eight of the said small pieces instead of a cut of timber under a
Pound and disquise of the so small pieces being quarters of a cut, when in reality the so pieces are found
sometimes to be (at the best) but the 10th part of a cut, sometimes the 24th part ~~or less~~ sometimes
the 23th part & sometimes the 48th part of a cut made for timber, as the trees are very great or as
they are smaller

Jury and afterwards the letter given in Court to Col: Brown. it did pertaine to mustering of soldiers
in our County the well fusing of drums, as also some injury done to Indians etc.

For Ma. Somerset County Mr. Sagus Riggan of this County Blaxbifton was summond to answer unto
Herr Ma. in a place of debt ^{his} day of March 1689 upon Record as by the said Recognizance hee had it doct and may appear now
and was upon thos Ma. attorney cause and saide by the said Sagus Riggan doct it
and stands in obliq^{ue} unto Herr Ma. in the full ^{his} just sum of 100 pounds money sterl.
as doct and may appear by a Recognizance Entred and subscribed the thirteenth day of
last John: Dom, 1689 upon Record as by the said Recognizance hee had it doct and may appear now
in his said doct did bind and oblig^{ue} him self to be of his good behaviour and abiding to all Herr Ma. good people
& his Preynt in the said sum of 10. Sterling money to be levied upon the said Sagus Riggan his goods & chattels
and instruments. yet notwithstanding standynge of the said Recognizance as so it doct upon Record in his County Court, notwithstanding
my release from the said Recognizance upon the 11th day of November last past before Herr Ma. Com. in open Court brought to
court for his overall misdeameours and breare of his Maitys Law, and then and there adjudged to pay in the sum of 100^{sterl}
as above mentioned his 13th day of March 1689 as above d^r above record judgment agt & to be paid for & allowed sum according to law.
