Conserf County for the service for their Malib's being sworn upon the true Evangelist at a grand Jury held for the body of this County, the second Tuesday in June last past do present and find that Robert Down of this County Planter is of full fame and by the inhabitants of this County especially of villages where he is Robert libote, suspected together with one Jas. R. R. of the same County Planter to have ranged the woods without licence from authority of this Prebute and hale taken up one horse Colt belonging to Cap. Jas. G. of this County Gent, and upon the 20 and twoentie of July last past did bring the sae horse Colt without his knowldge Caput or privity of the sae Cap. Jas. G. of this County Contrary to the law, as also to the great losse damage & detriment not only of the sae Jas. G. but also of all the good people of this Prebute, and as it is publick record, whiche hee promisid the abovesd Robert Down hale committed and is therefore guilty, therfore their Malib's attorney Crabs judgment may be entered agst the sae Down according to law. etc.

The Indictment being read to whiche the sae Robert Down pleaded not guilty, and for tryall put himself upon the Country whereupon Command was given to the Sheriff to summon twelve good and lawfull men of his neighbourhood that the matter might be tried by twelve Jurors, whose names are as followeth viz: Peter Dryer Jas. Scott Jas. Henderson Jas. Drifon Thomas Horbman Jas. Mells. Milles. Gray Edward Sims Jas. H. H. Henry Hudson David Bryan Bartholomew Cull, who being duly returned impannelled and sworn having heard the facts Indictm. as also the oaths of these eight witnesses hereafter named, viz: Thomas Gordon. Thomas. de Bovre. John Rithm. Edward R. Richard de Bovre. Thomas. Willson. Jas. Gillo. Jas. Richards. Jas. J. whiche Jury having heard their charges are sent forth to determine the same. — And being now returned to bring in their following verdict, which is Ordred to be returned as followeth viz: the Jury finde for the plaintiff, and adjudge the Colt at fifti hundred pound of tobacco. — And therfore it is this Courts judgment that they pay four fold seuerall from the sae R. R. & Down each of them one thousand pounds of tobacco — Likewise it is further Ordred that the sae Robert Down give security for his good behaviour, and thereupon came the sae Robert Down with his two Sureties viz: John Rithm. and Richard de Bovre. And the sae Down did by recognizance acknowledge him selfe to be bound to their Malib's in the sum of ten pounds sterling money of England, and the sae Jas. Rithm. & Richard de Bovre in the sum of five pounds like money to be laid upon their goods and Chattels Land and movables for their Malib's use etc.
