CHAP. I.

Passed Dec 23

Salary ascertained

CHAPTER I.

An Act to settle and ascertain the Salary of the Members of the Council for the ensuing Year. Lib. TH. No. 2, fol. 431.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That each member of the council shall be entitled to receive, for the ensuing year, the sum of two hundred pounds current money for his salary.

An Act for the relief of Elizabeth Fling of Allegany County. Lib. TH. No. 2, fol. 431. A Private Act.

CHAP. III.

Passed Dec. 23.

An Act for the benefit of Elizabeth Coate, of Baltimore County. Lib. TH. No. 2, fol. 432. A Private Act.

CHAP. IV.

Passed Dec. 23.

An Act to give validity and operation to the Deeds of Conveyance therein mentioned(a). Lib. TH. No. 2, fol. 432. A Private Act.

CHAP. V.

Passed Dec. 23.

An Act for the relief of Oliver R. Howell, of the state of Delaware. Lib. TH. No. 2, fol. 435. A Private Act.

Authorising a conveyance to be made to him by John Creswell, sheriff of Cecil county, of Lot number 33, in Elkton, being part of a tract of land called *Friendship*, formerly conveyed by Joseph Thomas, senior, to Zacharias Endress.

An Act to establish the Line between Frederick and Washington Counties. Lib. TH. No. 2, fol. 433.
