CHAP. I.

CHAPTER I.

Passed Dec 19.

An Act to confirm certain Acts of Justices of the Peace who hold or have held Offices under the General Government. Lib. TH. No. 4, fol. 231.

Official acts confirmed

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the official acts heretofore performed of any justice of the peace in this state, who, at the time he acted as such, held an office under the government of the United States, shall have the same effect and operation as if such justice of the peace had not been an officer under the government of the United States.

CHAP. II.

Passed Dec 15.

An Act authorising the Trustees of the Roman Catholic Church in the City of Baltimore to purchase a Lot to be used as a Burying Ground. Lib. TH. No. 4, fol. 231.

Lot not to exceed six acres

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the trustees of the Roman Catholic Church in the city of Baltimore, at the time being, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to purchase a lot of ground in Baltimore county, not exceeding six acres, and to hold the same to them, and their successors, as and for a burial ground for the members of said church, and for no other use or purpose whatever.
