whom, not having an interest in said road, shall estimate the value CHAP. 114. of the property which said company have therein, and whenever the amount so estimated shall be paid to said company, their right to toll on said road, and all their right, title and interest therein, shall cease.

10. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners herein named Commissioners to shall appoint five commissioners to locate and survey the said turn- locate and survey pike road, and to exhibit a plot thereof at the time of opening the road books of subscription for the said capital stock, which plot however shall not be binding on the said company.

CHAP. CXV.

A Further Supplement to the act*, entitled, An act to incorporate a Passed Jan 20 1816 Company to make a Turnpike Road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the Charters of the several Banks in this State, and

for other purposes. Lib. TH. No. 4, fol. 602.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That made valid the several appointments made by the different banks in this state, of managers of the Cumberland turnpike road company, and all their proceedings had under such appointments, shall be, and are hereby declared to be, as valid as if the said managers had been appointed agreeably to law.

CHAP, CXVI.

An Act authorising the Levy Court of Prince-George's County to levy Passed Jan 20 1816 on said County money for the support of sundry Persons as Out Pensioners. Lib. TH. No. 4, fol. 603.

1. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Muryland, That Levy authorised it shall and may be lawful for the levy court of Prince-George's ton persons county to assess and levy annually, on the assessable property of said county, so long as they may deem necessary, such sum as to them may seem reasonable, not exceeding thirty dollars each, for the support of Mary Mayhem. Rachel Damson. Elizabeth Piles, Mary O.Neal, Anne O.Neal, James Liuch, James Watoon, senior, David Gibson, John Pierce, senior, and an afflicted child of Sar h Locker, and such others as in their judgment may require aid, not exceeding fifteen, including the above named persons, as out-pensioners, which sums, when levied, shall be collected and paid over by the collector of said county to the persons authorised by the said court to receive the same, for the benefit of the persons abovementioned.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall be lawful for the said sum may be paid levy court to order the collector of the county to pay to any of the money above mentioned persons who may appear to them to be in a suffering condition, such sum as they may judge necessary for the relief of such person, out of any surplus money which may remain in his hands unappropriated.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall be lawful for said court to Allowance to children of Thomas allow Isaac Ball such sum as they may deem reasonable, not ex. Ball ceeding fifty dollars annually, so long as they shall see cause, for the support of such of the infant children of the late Thomas Ball, as the said court may deem necessary to provide for as out-pensioners.
