death, and if this act had not passed, would be entitled to the said CHAP. 188. lot, with power to him the said William Gwynn, his executors and administrators, and it is hereby declared to be his and their duty to invest the said sum of money, so to be paid for the said lot, forthwith in bank stock of some incorporated bank or banks in the city of Baltimore, or in stock of the United States, on the best terms, and the dividends thereon, and the accumulations thereof, from time to time as they become due, to receive and invest in manner aforesaid for the use and benefit of the said Forster, and of the persons who may or would be entitled as aforesaid, until the said stock and accumulations thereof shall be transferred and paid over to the said John Mason Forster, or other person or persons entitled as aforesaid, or his or their agent or agents lawfully authorised.

3. And whereas by the will of Bridget Tull, exhibited to this legislature, and under which the said John Mason Forster claims the said lot, it is to go over to other persons in case of his death under the age of twenty-five years, and it appears that he will attain that age on the first day of January next, BE IT THERE- Stock purchased FORE ENACTED, That the stock to be purchased by the said William Gwynn, his executors and administrators as aforesaid, and the accumulations thereof, shall remain in her or their name for the uses aforesaid, untransferred until the said John Mason Forster shall attain his said age of twenty-five years, or depart this life; and that in case of his death, before he attains that age, the said stock, with the accumulations thereof as aforesaid, shall be held by the said William Gwynn, his executors and administrators, in trust for the persons who on that event would have been entitled to the said lot if this act had not passed, and shall be transferred and paid to them, or their agents duly authorised, in lieu and full satisfaction of the said lot, the right to use and keep open which as a public street for ever as aforesaid, shall in no wise be affected by the death of the said John Mason Forster before his age of twentyfive years.

## CHAP. CLXXXIX.

An Act to open a Road from William P. Patterson's Farm in Queen- Passed Jan 27 1916 Anne's County. Lib. TH. No. 5, fol. 69.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly by the perpreamble tition of William P. Patterson, of Harford county, that great and serious inconvenience doth arise to him in consequence of his having at the present time no road open from his farm to the public road: therefore,

1. BE IT ENACTED. by the General Assembly of Maryland, That commissioners appointed to lay out James Roberts, William Jacobs, George Finley, Campbell J. Cor-road nelius and George Godwin, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and open a road, not exceeding twenty feet in width, to the nearest public road, in the most convenient direction both for the petitioner and those persons through whose land the said road may pass.

2. And he it enacted, That the said commissioners, or a ma-plottobe recorded jority of them, shall and they are hereby directed and required, to make or cause to be made, a plot of said road, when opened as aforesaid, and shall make a return of said plot, together with a certificate of the courses of the said road, to the clerk of Queen-
