collected, or in case of neglect or refusal to pay, by public sale of CHAP. 201. the property ascertained and determined to be benefitted by the law to which this is a further supplement, or the supplement thereto, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, of the person or persons so neglecting or refusing to pay, he giving at least thirty days notice of such sale, previous thereto, in two or more of the newspapers published in the city of Baltimore, and when collected, to pay over the same to the person or persons respectively entitled to receive the same, and in case of the persons entitled to damages refusing to receive the same when tendered, the tender shall be considered as good and sufficient to enable the commissioners to proceed to open the street, as if the said damages had been received; Provided Proviso; always, nothing herein contained shall be so construed as to prevent the ultimate payment of damages to such person or persons as may be justly entitled to receive the same, without interest, from the time of making such tender; and as a compensation for his services, the said collector shall be entitled to a commission on the whole amount to be by him collected, of seven and an half per cent.
