An Act to Incorporate the Hiberman Society of Baltimore. Lib. TH. Passed Feb 11 1818 No. 6, fol. 102.

1. BE IT ENACTED. by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Society incorpothe members of the Hibernian Society of Baltimore, and air those who shall hereafter become members, shall be and are hereby incorporated and created a body politic, by the name, style and title, of "The Hibernian Society of Baltimore," and by that name shall have continual succession, and be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, to plead and be impleaded, in any court of record, or elsewhere, to make, have and use, a common scal, and the same at pleasure to alter or renew; to receive donations, gifts, grants, devises and bequests, or other conveyances of money, goods, chattels, effects, lands, tenements and estates, real and personal, and the same to hold, use, sell, or otherwise dispose of and convey; and generally to do all such acts, matters and things, as are or shall be necessary for the purpose of affording charitable assistance and advice to such emigrants from, or natives of Ireland, arriving at or residing in any part of the state of Mary and, as may be in want and deemed worthy; Provided always, that the clear annual Provised value of the property, held or owned by the said society shall not exceed ten thousand dollars.

2.
