BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the levy courts of Prince-George's and Anne-Arundel counties, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered, to levy on the assessable property of their respective counties, such sum of money as they may dee a necessary, to lay out and complete, at the joint expense of the two counties, the road designated in the law to which this is a supplement, provided the said levy courts shall think it expedient, and for the interest of their respective counties so to do, any thing in the law to which this is a supplement to the contrary notwithstanding.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all expenses which may be incurred in the execution of the law to which this is a supplement, shall be levied by the mayor and city council of Baltimore on all the assessable property within the limits of the said city, as declared and laid off by the act\* to enlarge the bounds of Baltimore city, the amount of which expenses shall be ascertained by Baltimore city court, and certified by the clerk thereof to the said mayor and city council, who are hereby authorised

and required to provide for the collection and payment of the same. 2. AND BE IT ENACTED. That the salaries of the associate judges of the said court, allowed by the act aforesaid, shall be paid to them quarterly out of the treasury of the said city.
