CHAP. LXVI.

An Act to increase the allowance to the Sheriff of Frederick County, for the keeping of Prisoners and supporting them in Gaol. Lib. TH. No. 6, fol. 280.

Allowance increased

1. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall and may be lawful for the sheriff of Frederick county to ask, demand and receive, for all persons committed to the gaol of said county, and provided with victuals by the said sheriff, the sum of twenty-five cents per day for each prisoner, in lieu of the sum now allowed, to be levied and collected according to law.

2. And be it enacted, That this act shall continue and be in force for three years from and after the passage hereof.

## CHAP. LXVII.

Passed Jan 27, 1819 An Act for the benefit of William Palmer, senior, and others, of Prince Georges's County. Lib. TH. No 6, fol. 281.

Levy authorised for their support

BE IT ENACTED. by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the levy court of Prince-George's county shall be, and is hereby authorised, so long as the said court shall see fit, to assess and levy, annually, on the assessable property of said county, a sum of money not exceeding thirty dollars for each, for the support of William Palmer, senior. Zachariah Scott, Rachel Vermillion, in Mood, Elizabeth Wood and Ruth Hinton, and the same shall be collected and paid over to them, or their order, in the same manner that other county levies are collected and paid.

Preamble

Whereas the most Reverend Ambrose Marechal, Archbishop of Baltimore, the Reverend Enoch Fenwick, pastor of the Roman Catholic Metropolitan church of Baltimore, and sundry other persons, members of the said church, have associated for the purpose of maintaining and educating poor orphan and other destitute female children, and instructing them in the christian religion, and
