CHAP. 106, to enforce the removal of the same, but the ground covered thereby shall be valued by three disinterested persons, to be appointed by the said commissioners, and the amount of such valuation paid by the person or persons owning the property, into the general fund created by the original act to which this is a supplement, for the use and purposes therein mentioned.

in case of refusal to be proceeded against.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That where any person or persons having property situate as aforesaid, shall refuse or neglect to pay such valuation as herein before directed, the commissioners of the said town, or a majority of them, may proceed against such person or persons, in the same manner, for the recovery thereof, as they are directed to proceed for the recovery of forfeitures under the original law to which this is a supplement.

CHAP, CVII.

Passed Feb 3, 1819 An Act for the relief of John Frey, of Cecil County. Lib. TH. No. 6, fol. 321.

Benefit of insolvent laws extend-ed to him.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the judges of Cecil county court be and they are hereby authorised, to extend to John Frey, of Cecil county, the benefit of the existing insolvent laws of the state. without requiring the assent in writing of two thirds of his creditors in amount.

CHAP, CVIII.

Passed Feb 3, 1819 An Act for the relief of the Eldest Daughter of Eleanor Nicholes, of Montgomery County. Lib. TH. No. 6, fol. 321.

Levy authorised t'e her support.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland. That the levy court of Montgomery county be, and they are bereby authorised, to levy on the assessable property of said county, annually, as long as they may deem proper, a sum of money not exceeding thirty dollars, for the support and maintenance of the eldest daughter of said Eleanor Nicholes, and that the same shall be collected by the collector of said county, and by him paid to Eleanor Nicholes, or her order, for the use and benefit of her said eldest daughter.

CHAP. CIX.

Passed Fc. 2, 1819 An Act to incorporate the Trustees of Big Pipe Creek Academy, in Frederick County Lib. TH. No. 6, fol. 321.

Preamble

WHEREAS sundry inhabitants of Frederick county have, by their petition, set forth to the general assembly, that they have purchased a lot of ground in the vicinity of Big Pipe Creek, in said county, and intend creeting thereon suitable buildings for a seminary of learning, and have prayed for an act of incorporation for the regulation of said seminary; and it appearing reasonable that the prayer of said petitioners ought to be granted, therefore,

Trustees appointed and incorporated.

1. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That David Kephart, Jacob Yon, and William B. Hebbard, be and they are hereby appointed trustees of said seminary, to act as such until the first Monday of November eighteen hundred and nincteon; and the said trustees, and their successors, to be elected in the manner herein after mentioned, shall be and they are hereby erected, established and declared, to be one community, corporation and
