

CHAP. 172.

Passed Jan 30 1819

Preamble

Their acts made valid

An Act to confirm and make valid the Acts and Proceedings of James Steuart and Thomas Tenant as Justices of the Peace for Baltimore County. Lib. TH. No. 6, fol. 387.

WHEREAS James Steuart and Thomas Tenant were in the commission of the peace for Baltimore county during the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, and for several years previously thereto, and believing that they were commissioned for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, did continue to act for some time, until they were at different times respectively restored to the commission of the peace in and for the county aforesaid; therefore,

1. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all acts and proceedings which have been done and made by the said James Steuart and Thomas Tenant, during the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, as justices of the peace for Baltimore county, shall be as valid, and shall have the same effect and operation in law, as if the said James Steuart and Thomas Tenant had been duly commissioned and qualified as justices of the peace of the state of Maryland in and for Baltimore county, according to the law of the state of Maryland.

CHAP. CLXXIII.

Passed Feb 13 1819

Authorised to erect a platform upon west side of Commerce-street

Provisos

Wharfage accruing from east side of said improvement

An Act authorising Charles Gwinn, and Company, to extend their Wharf on Commerce-Street, in the City of Baltimore. Lib. TH. No. 6, fol. 387.

1. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Charles Gwinn, and company, be and they are hereby authorised, to erect a platform upon the west side of Commerce-street, in the sixth ward of the city of Baltimore, in the manner delineated upon a plot dated the fifth day of January eighteen hundred and nin teen, signed Jehu Bouldin, marked C. G. and deposited in the mayor's office of said city; *Provided*, that said extension be made in a substantial, durable, and workmanlike manner, and kept in good repair, to be approved of by the port wardens; *And provided*, the said Charles Gwinn and company convey to the mayor and city council of said city, all their right, title and interest, in and to the east side, and six feet width thereof.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all the wharfage accruing from the east side of said improvement, shall be collected by the proper officer appointed by the said city for that purpose.

CHAP. CLXXIV.

Passed Feb 15 1819

An Act for the relief of Samuel Stevens, and Eliza his Wife, of Talbot County. Lib TH. No. 6, fol. 388. A Private Act.

David Paten appointed a trustee to execute to Eliza M. Stevens, wife of Samuel Stevens, a deed in fee simple for one undivided fourth part of the lands and tenements belonging to Elk Forge, in Cecil county, whereof Robert May died seized.

CHAP. CLXXV.

Passed Feb 15 1819

An Act for the benefit of Thomas B. Tilden and Ann Maria Brice. Lib. TH. No. 6, fol. 389. A Private Act.

The deed executed by the former to the latter made valid, provided it be recorded, &c.
