Whoever being married, shall (the first husband or wife, as the case may be, being alive,) marry any person or persons, shall undergo a confinement in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than 9 years, — No to extend to any person whose husband or wife shall be continually remaining beyond the seas seven years together, or shall be absent seven years together within the United States, or elsewhere, the one not knowing the other to be living at the time, If such offender be a man, his first wife shall, on his conviction, be forthwith endowed of one third of his real estate, the assignment and recovery to be as in other cases of dower, and shall be entitled to one third of his personal estate as if he had died intestate, and she had	1809 138 7 — — — — —
