EMIGRANTS.	—	Before the adoption of the constitution of the United States, and continuing inhabitants, entitled to hold real estate, &c. <i>Sec Citizens.</i>	1813 105
	—	Emigrants since the adoption of the said constitution, and who had acquired lands or title thereto, and afterwards become naturalized, to enjoy such lands, &c. as if naturalized at the time of acquisition,	1814 79
