FINAL DISCHARGE.	To executors, &c. if acknowledged before any justice or register of wills, may be recorded by the register, — A copy under seal to be admitted as evidence, — If by non-residents, a certificate of the acknowledgment to be recorded, &c. FINES AND FORFEITURES.
