HOUSE BREAKING.	Every person, his aids, &c. convicted of breaking a dwelling house in the day, or a store house, &c. in the day or night, with intent to commit murder or felony therein, to be sentenced to confinement in the penitentiary, not less than two nor more than ten years, Every person convicted of breaking into a shop, &c. though not contiguous to or used with a dwelling house, and stealing money, goods, &c. to the value of one dollar or upwards, or as being accessory thereto, to restore the thing taken, or pay the value, and to be sentenced to confinement in the penitentiary not less than 2 nor more than 12 years, Any person apprehended having on him any pick lock, &c. with intent to break into any dwelling house &c. or found in or about the same, with intent to steal, to be deemed a rogue and vagabond, and on conviction sentenced to confinement in the penitentiary not less than 3 months nor more than 2 years,	1809 138 5 ----- ----- ----- 7
