PRESIDENT & VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.	An amendment respecting the manner of their election proposed by congress to the several states, ratified, 1803 65 The state divided into nine districts for choosing eleven electors of the president and vice-president, 1805 97 3 The election of electors directed to be on the second Monday of November 1808, and on the same day in every fourth year thereafter, — — — 9 The electors of president and vice-president directed to assemble on the first Wednesday in December 1808, and in every fourth year thereafter, at the city of Annapolis, and perform the duties enjoined on them, — — — 21 Unless congress should otherwise direct, and in that event on the day directed, — — — — The governor and council, on receiving the returns of electors to choose the president and vice-president, &c. to ascertain the votes given for each, and thereupon declare by proclamation, signed by the governor, the names of the persons elected, — — — 33 Such proclamation to be inserted in such newspapers on both shores as they may direct, — — — — Where two or more candidates have an equal number of votes, the governor and council to determine on the election by lot, — — — 34 The allowance of the electors increased, 1811 156
