VALUATION OF PROPERTY.	<p>All real and personal property in the state to be valued (and to be chargeable with the public assessment accordingly,) except as therein enumerated,</p> <p style="text-align: right;">1812 191 1</p> <p>— Property excepted, viz.</p> <p>— Property belonging to the state or the United States.</p> <p>— Houses for public worship.</p> <p>— Burying grounds.</p> <p>— Property belonging to any county.</p> <p>— Property belonging to any college or county school.</p> <p>— The crop or produce of the lands in the hands of the persons whose land produced the same, or in the hands of the tenant.</p>
