Acts and Orders, enacted, made and ordered, by WILLIAM STONE, Esquire. Governor, with the consent of the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, at a general session thereof, begun the 6th and ended the 29th day of April 1650,

CHAP. I.

CHAP. II.

An act for the Erecting of Providence into a County, by the Name of Ann-Arundel County. Lib. C and WH. fol. 134. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 17. Ditto

Confirmed among the perpetual Laws. 1676. ch. 2.

By this act, that part of the Province of Maryland, on the west side of the Bay of Chesapeake, over against the Isle of Kent, formerly called by the name of Providence, by the inhabitants there residing, &c. shall from henceforth be erected into a Shire or County, by the Name of Ann-Arundel County, and by that name to be ever hereafter called.
