CHAP. XXII.

An additional act against Hog-Stealers.

CHAP. XXIII.

An act for the Burgesses Expenses. Repealed by 1676, ch. 2.

Ditte.

Acts made at the General Assembly, begun and held at St. Mary's, the 15th September 1633, in the 32d year of the Dominion of the Right Honourable Coccilius, absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon, Lord Baron of Baltimore, &c. and there continued till Saturday the 3d October following; and thence adjourned till the second Tuesday in September 1664, and ended the 21st day of the same month.

CHAP. L.

For 3 years, &c. Continued by various reviving acts, till 1692. A new act made 1692, ch. 31. Expired.

CHAP. II.

An act for Amerciaments in the Provincial and County Courts. Ditto, Lib. C and WH. fol. 150. Lib. WH. fol. 71. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 27.

For 3 years, &c. Continued successively till 1692. A new act 1692, ch 55. Expired.

CHAP. III.

An act repealing an Act made Anno 1661, entitled, *An Act con-Ditte. cerning killing wild Cattle. Lib. C and WH. fol. 151. and Lib. WH and L. fel. 27.

*1661, ch. 11. Confirmed 1676, ch. 2.

CHAP. IV.

An act concerning Proceedings at Law. Lib. C and WH. fol. 152. Bitto and Lib. WH and L. fol. 28.

This act was revived by 1678, ch. 15, excepting one clause. In which state this law was successively continued, till 1684, when it totally expired. His Lordship's dissent to this law, was declared in Assembly, the 13th April 1669; it was also repealed by 1676, ch. 2, and again revived as above in 1678.
