Passed May 16,
1666.

The humble Petition of Capt. James Neale. Lib. C and WH. fol. 160. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 33. A Private Act.

Viz. For Naturalization of his four children, Henrietta Maria, James, Dorothy and Anthony Neale, born in Spain, of Anna his wife. Confirmed 1676, ch. 2.

CHAP. IX.

Ditto

An act for the Publication of all Laws, within this Province, for the future. Lib. C and WH. fol. 161. Lib. WH. fol. 144. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 33.

Confirmed among the perpetual laws, by 1676, ch. 2. A new law 1692, ch. 24.

CHAP. X.

Ditto

An act empowering the Governor and Council, to make War or Peace, with any Indian Enemy, beyond the Bounds of this Province.

Confirmed among the perpetual acts 1676, ch. 2. But repealed by 1678, ch. 16.

CHAP. XI.

Ditto

An act for recording the Journal of the Lower House.

A new act 1684, ch 4. Repealed by 1676, ch. 2.

CHAP. XII.

Ditto

An act for marking Highways, and making the Heads of Rivers, Creeks, Branches and Swamps, passable for Horse and Foot.

A new act made 1669, ch. 13. Repealed by 1676, ch. 2.

An act concerning Outlawries Repealed by 1676, ch. 2.

An act explaining an act, entitled * An act for the Muster-Master General's Fees. Repealed by 1676, ch. 2.

An act for the Clerk's Fees, and Allowance of Jurors in civil Causes.

An act for the Repeal of an Act, entitled, An act for the Encouragement of William Smith in his undertaking the Country's Work at St. Mary's. Repealed by 1676, ch. 2.
