

CHAP. II.

An act for repeal of certain laws; and also for ascertaining what laws are in force within this Province. Lib. C and WH. fol. 288. Passed 15th June 1676.
 Lib. WH. fol. 4. and Lib. WH and L. fol. 120.

By this act (and the foregoing) the laws of the province, which for several years had remained in a doubtful state, were absolutely fixed to this period: His Lordship being present, and giving his final assent in Assembly to the laws therein mentioned, and to the formal repeal of others.
