

- Calvert County, { On the south side of Patuxent River, between Ab-
 bington's creek and Joseph Edloes, to be called
 St. Joseph's-Town.
 At Bowling's Point, in the freshes of Patuxent, to
 be called Bowlington.
 Dorchester County, { Upon a tract of land called Morgan, near the head
 of Fishing Creek, in Little Choptank, to be call-
 ed Dorchester.
 Talbot County, { On the north side of Corsica Creek, at a place call-
 ed Gleven's Point, to be called Talbot-Town.

The which several Towns, Ports, and places of trade, to be under such restric-
 tions and limitations, and also to enjoy the full benefit, &c. of any other towns,
 &c. by the several acts for the advancement of Trade, &c.

An act against the Exportation of Wool and old Iron. Lib. WH. Ditto.

Three years, or to the end of the next assembly. A new act 1692, ch. 45.

CHAP. XI.

An act for Payment and Assessing of the public Charge of this Ditto.
 Province. Lib. WH. fol. 310. Obsolete.

N. B. On the 23d August 1689, the convention met at St. Mary's by virtue of
 letters missive, from the several commanders, officers, and gentlemen associated
 in arms, for the defence of the protestant religion, and asserting the right and title
 of their present majesties, King William and Queen Mary, to this province, as
 to all other the English dominions and territories; and made choice of Mr. Ke-
 nelm Cheseldine for their speaker. In which convention it was voted and ordered
 (on the 2d September) "that the temporary laws of this province do stand and
 "continue revived for 3 years from their commencement, or otherwise in statu
 "quo prius, as if this assembly had not been."

On the 29th September 1690, the convention met again, and appointed Col.
 Geo. Robotham their speaker, or chairman.

They published an ordinance or proclamation, on the 6th October, prohibiting
 the exportation of Indian corn, until the 10th July following.

The same day was read a draught for the repeal of three acts, viz. 1688, chap-
 ters 5, 7, and 8; but was rejected, as not within the cognizance of that house.

The convention being met on the 9th April 1692, his excellency Lyonel Cop-
 ley, Esq. produced, and caused to be read, his commission for the government of
 this province, and on the same day, in his majesty's name, dissolved the same.
