BE IT ENACTED, by the Queen's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of her Majesty's Governor, Council, and Assembly of this Province, and the authority of the same, That the act of assembly made at a general assembly begun and held at the port of Annapolis, the twenty-seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord sixteen hundred and ninety-nine, entitled, "An act ascertaining the bounds of land," and every clause, matter and thing therein contained, is hereby declared to be and remain in full force and effect to all intents, constructions, and purposes whatsoever, to the end of the next sessions of assembly; this present sessions not having leisure fully to consider thereof.
