**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby required, to pay to James Semmes, of Charles county, late a second lieutenant in the revolutionary war, or to his order, annually in quarterly payments, during his life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a second lieutenant.

Passed Jan 2, 1813

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby directed and required, to pay annually to William Hillman, or order, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a soldier, as a remuneration to the said William Hillman for services rendered his country in the revolutionary war, and as a relief from the indigence and misery which attend his old age.

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Michael O'Connor, of Harford county, or to his order, a sum of money in quarterly payments, equal to the half pay of a matross, as a further remuneration for those services rendered his country during the revolutionary war.

In favour of Thos.  
Simpson

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby directed, to pay to Thomas Simpson, late a corporal in the revolutionary war, or to his order, a sum of money annually in quarterly payments, equal to the half pay of a corporal, as a further remuneration for those services rendered his country in her struggle for liberty and independence.

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the eastern shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay annually, unto John Bolton, or his order, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private in the late revolutionary war.

**RESOLVED**, That the governor and council be, and they are hereby requested, forthwith, to send a deputation to Washington, for the purpose of ascertaining what further protection will be offered by the general government against the incursions of the common enemy, and also what provision may be expected to liquidate the necessary expenditures which have been or may be incurred in providing against their aggressions.

**WHEREAS** it appears from the communication of the treasurer of the western shore, that William Marbury, late agent of the state of Maryland, has not complied with the resolution of November session eighteen hundred and twelve, directing the said William Marbury to transfer to Benjamin Harwood, trustee, all the old six per cent. and deferred, and three per cent. stock now standing in his name, belonging to the state: therefore,
