**RESOLVED,** That the treasurer of the western shore pay to John D. Jaquet, a sergeant in the revolutionary war, annually in quarterly payments, the half pay of a sergeant for life, as a further remuneration for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.

**RESOLVED,** That his excellency the governor of Maryland, be requested to transmit to the executive of Virginia a copy of the act entitled, An act for erecting a bridge over the River Potomac, with a request that the same be laid before the legislature of said state.

**RESOLVED,** That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Andrew Lord, a soldier in the revolutionary war, or to his order annually, in quarterly payments, during life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a remuneration for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.

**WHEREAS,** it appears to this general assembly, that James Wilkinson, an officer of the revolutionary war, and who served to its termination, did not receive the commutation money of five years pay, in lieu of half pay for life, promised to the officers and soldiers, who continued in service to the end of the war; therefore,
