No. 18.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to William Niblet, of Worcester county, an old revolutionary soldier, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, during his life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration to him for his services by which his country has been so much benefitted.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed, to pay unto Basil Burgess, (an officer in the revolutionary war) or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a lieutenant, during his life, as a further remuneration for those services rendered his country during her struggle for independence.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore of Maryland pay to Lawrence Hurdle, or his order, annually, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a sergeant, as a further remuneration for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.
